



Where's My Economic Impact Payment from the IRS?

In March, Congress passed and President Trump signed into law the CARES Act, a \$2 trillion economic relief package to provide assistance to American consumers and businesses struggling as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. A provision of the law includes sending government payments to eligible Americans. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has named these *Economic Impact Payments*.

The IRS began distributing these payments the week of April 13. Most taxpayers who filed tax returns in 2018 and 2019, and most seniors and retirees will get their payments automatically and will not need to take any action. Social Security beneficiaries who are not typically required to file tax returns will not need to file to receive a payment. Payments will be automatically deposited into their bank accounts.

IRS Tool - Get My Payment

The IRS *Get My Payment* tool is working and available. *Get My Payment* provides people with the status of their *Economic Impact Payment*, including the date their payment is scheduled to be deposited into their bank account or mailed to them.

An additional feature on *Get My Payment* allows eligible people a chance to provide their bank account information so they can receive their payment more quickly rather than waiting for a paper check.

Check for your payment using Online and Mobile Banking

To check if an *Economic Impact Payment* has been deposited into your account, use our online and mobile banking services available 24/7. If you have not already, you can enroll quickly on our home page.

What if my bank account information or address has changed?

You may use the IRS *Get My Payment* tool to enter your new bank account information for direct deposit as long as the IRS has not sent your payment yet by paper check.
